## SERIES DESCRIPTION

**THE CORNELL EAST ASIA SERIES (CEAS)** is published and subsidized by the East Asia Program of Cornell University. CEAS produces scholarly monographs, translations of literature and major works of literary criticism or social analysis, specialized textbooks, and well-integrated volumes of articles on important subjects dealing with the cultures of China (both the PRC and Taiwan), Japan, and Korea (both north and south).

Our goal is to publish high-quality works at reasonable prices and to keep works in print as long as there is moderate interest. Newer titles are published initially in both paperback and hardcover editions. To assure high quality, manuscripts are reviewed by both internal (usually Cornell faculty) and external examiners. Authors are invited to submit camera-ready copy that meets CEAS guidelines; no royalties are given.

CEAS encourages the use of illustrations in our books and accompanying video, CDs, or other appropriate materials. We will consider proposals for electronic publication.

## SUBSERIES

### **ANNOTATED JAPANESE LITERARY GEMS** Series edited by Kyoko Selden and Jolisa Gracewood

This series makes available representative examples of annotated Japanese short stories and novellas from Meiji to the present. The set of six books provides *rubi* for nearly all *kanji* at first use. With its extensive annotations, the collection serves as a resource for students of modern Japanese literature and may also be used as an intermediate to advanced language text. The volumes are printed Japanese-style, with pages ordered from right to left. Currently available are Volumes One and Two.

## CEAS REVIEW PROCESS

Authors submit two printed copies of completed manuscripts (sending manuscripts as e-mail attachments is not acceptable). Only completed manuscripts are considered; minimum length is 100 pages formatted (approximately 50,000 words); please do not exceed 500 pages formatted. Please set the manuscript in double-spaced 12-point type, pagination is required.

After an initial internal review, if the work is judged to be generally of the quality and type that fit CEAS's goals, we sign up two readers for in-depth reviews on an author-anonymous basis. Because the outside review process is demanding on readers and expensive, we ask the author for the right of first refusal in writing before sending the manuscripts out for review. The internal and external reader reviews are forwarded to the editorial board, which makes the final decision on what manuscripts to publish. The evaluation process can take up to six months.

Please know that if your manuscript exceeds 500 formatted pages, the evaluation process may take longer than normal. Please also understand that our reviewers may not be able to read your manuscript in a timely manner if the manuscript exceeds 500 formatted pages. ## **PREPARING CAMERA-READY COPY**

Upon notification of manuscript acceptance, we ask authors to sign a publication agreement, see [http://www.einaudi.cornell.edu/eastasia/publications/pdf/sample\\_contract.pdf](http://www.einaudi.cornell.edu/eastasia/publications/pdf/sample_contract.pdf). It is the author's responsibility to obtain all necessary permissions in writing (see sample permissions form and cover letter at: [http://www.einaudi.cornell.edu/eastasia/publications/pdf/sample\\_letter.pdf](http://www.einaudi.cornell.edu/eastasia/publications/pdf/sample_letter.pdf)).

The author is invited to submit the manuscript in camera-ready copy prepared according to current CEAS guidelines, which follow *The Chicago Manual of Style*. A set of guidelines will be sent to the authors who submit their manuscript in camera-ready format. While submitting camera-ready format requires that the author be responsible for all copyediting, proofreading, and formatting, it does give the author control over the entire process. The CEAS managing editor will work with the author in designing the book and its cover.

## **SUBVENTIONS**

Some authors receive subsidies from their own universities or from other organizations to help with the preparation of camera-ready copy. CEAS can sometimes provide information about subsidies for specific types of manuscripts. We ask all authors to explore the possibilities for obtaining a publication subsidy.

## **PUBLICATION SPECIFICS**

Authors who submit camera-ready copy must inform CEAS in advance that they are doing so. CEAS volumes are 5½" x 8½" in size; book length is generally between 100 and 400 pages, single-spaced. The books are sold on a nonprofit basis.

The usual first print run with no publication subsidy is 500 paperback and 200 hardcover copies. CEAS may release hardcover edition before the paperback edition.

## **COPYRIGHT**

Authors hold the copyright to the work. A paragraph describing the Cornell East Asia Series inserted on the copyright page. Two complimentary copies of the book are provided to fulfill the copyright law's mandatory deposit requirements with the Library of Congress. Simple instructions are provided on how to do this, as well as information on copyright registration, which is optional.

## **ROYALTIES**

CEAS does not pay royalties, although this practice may change. Ten copies are provided gratis to the author, and authors receive a 40% discount off list price on any additional copies they may wish to order. The East Asia Program asks the author to suggest places to send the book for review. We provide a list of review journals for reference and ask authors for additional ones that they wish to include on the list. In addition to complimentary review copies, we send desk copies to teachers as suggested by the author.

## **ADVERTISING AND DISTRIBUTION**

We advertise our books via mail-order, with an annual catalog mailing, and on our web page [www.einaudi.cornell.edu/eastasia/publications](http://www.einaudi.cornell.edu/eastasia/publications). The books are also advertised through flyers sent to special interest groups, through advertisements in scholarly journals, and are displayed and sold at the annual Association of Asian Studies meeting and other regional book displays as well as through Amazon.com.

CEAS volumes are distributed by Cornell University Press Services.
